The accident occurred as the aircraft was landing on runway 27 at Snetterton. The runway surface, which is of grass, was described by the pilot as being dry and in good condition. The weather at the time was fine with calm conditions, good visibility, no low cloud and a surface temperature of 21°C.

The approach was flown at a speed of 60 kt reducing to 50 to 55 kt during the flare. Ten to twenty metres after touchdown, which was made in the three point attitude, the aircraft suddenly veered to the right. Opposite rudder had no effect, so the pilot applied additional power in order to increase its effectiveness. This again had no effect and the aircraft continued turning to the right making contact with an earth embankment on the north side of the runway. The aircraft then rose up and turned coming to rest inverted. The pilot, who was restrained by a full five-point harness, vacated the aircraft without injury.

The pilot reported that the accident could have been caused due to the right wheel becoming locked from contamination with surface debris jamming between the tyre and the spat.
