The aircraft had flown earlier in the day and was being refuelled with MOGAS from a small bowser. The pilot, who was due to fly the next detail, was sitting in the cockpit. On completion of the refuelling some fuel was seen to be dripping from the tank overflow pipe. After about two minutes the pilot attempted to start the engine and, when it did not immediately fire, he pumped the throttle to assist the start. He next noticed some people trying to attract his attention and saw that fire had broken out in the cockpit footwell. He began to leave the aircraft when there was a muffled explosion which blew off most of the canopy and bowed the inboard section of the mainplane. The pilot was able to complete his escape after which the fire was extinguished by others at the scene. The pilot considers that the most likely source of initiation of the fire was from an engine backfire, a characteristic of this aircraft which was not uncommon.
