The pilot was practicing circuits on Runway 25 with a surface wind of 170°/18 kt. Just before touch down, the aircraft pitched nose down and yawed to the left before contacting the runway. Following a bounce, the next contact with the runway caused the nose landing gear oleo to fracture and the aircraft then departed the left side of the runway. The maximum crosswind component for landing this aircraft imposed by the operating club is 16 kt.
