Following an approach to runway 08, with a surface wind reported as north-westerly at 10 kts, the aircraft touched down about half way along the runway and bounced. The pilot initiated a go-around, but it soon became apparent that he would not clear the boundary hedge so he shut down the engine and switched off the master switch and the fuel. The aircraft struck the hedge and came to rest in the road beyond.

There was no fire and the pilot escaped uninjured. As the passenger complained of a pain in her back, it was decided that she should remain in the aircraft until expert assistance arrived. A doctor, who was on the airfield at the time, supervised her evacuation. Both occupants were wearing full upper torso restraint.
