The student pilot, on his third solo flight, was carrying out an approach to Runway 24. The weather conditions were CAVOK with a surface wind of 260°/10 to 15 kt. After a stabilised approach the pilot flared and, possibly due to fluctuating wind conditions, floated along the runway. The aircraft's speed reduced to the point of the stall whereupon the left wing dropped. The pilot, fearing that the left wing would strike the ground, initiated a go-around. The aircraft pitched sharply nose up and yawed to the left. The pilot was unable to correct the continuing roll to the left and the aircraft contacted the runway left wing first and came to rest 90° to the runway centreline.

Emergency services were quickly on the scene and assisted the pilot, who had been restrained by a lap and diagonal seat belt, from the aircraft.

Since the accident the student has received further training in stall recognition and the use of rudder.
