The pilot was making a flapless approach to Runway 03 on a grass airstrip; the strip is 300 metres long and bounded at both ends by a fence. The wind was calm and the pilot reported that the weather was hot and humid, with scattered cumulous cloud. Just before the threshold, the pilot increased power as he experienced a high sink rate. He regained his normal approach path, and then closed the throttle as he approached his touchdown point; the aircraft immediately entered a rapid descent and struck the ground just as the pilot re-applied power. The aircraft bounced back into the air and then, with the pilot slowly reducing power, made a second firm contact with the ground. This second impact caused the undercarriage supports to break, resulting in the propeller hitting the ground and the aircraft coming to a stop before overturning. The pilot stated that the atmospheric conditions caused the excessive sink rate just before touchdown.
