The aircraft was returning to the airfield after a short local flight in good weather but with an increasingly gusty wind. Whilst in the circuit for landing on runway 21, the pilot noted that the windsock indicated a wind varying between 210 and 250° at 15 kt, gusting to 20, blowing across the runway over hangers and a line of trees. Approximately 70 metres after touchdown, at a speed of 25 to 30 kt, the aircraft was thrown into the air by the combined effects of a large hump in the runway and a strong gust of wind. It stalled onto the ground again and the nosewheel collapsed. The aircraft then veered off the runway to the right and came to rest in a cornfield.
