During the pilot's first solo flight, whilst on final approach to land on runway 24, the aircraft appeared to suddenly drop the right wing and fall to the ground. The pilot has stated that the aircraft may have been too low on the approach and that she may have tried to raise the nose in an attempt to correct this.

There was no fire and the pilot's lap and diagonal restraint harness withstood the forces of the impact. Having unfastened her harness, the pilot climbed out of the aircraft via the left door.
