CC CANCELS FUTURE/HIGHBURY INQUIRY

The Competition Commission (CC) has today formally cancelled the reference concerning the proposed acquisition by Future PLC of Highbury House Communications PLC.

The CC has received assurances from Future PLC that the proposed acquisition has been abandoned.

The case was referred to the CC by the Office of Fair Trading (OFT) on 14 April 2005. The CC had been asked to consider whether the acquisition may have been expected to result in a substantial lessening of competition within the market for the supply of special interest consumer magazines relating to computer games in the UK.

Notes for editors

1. The reference was made by the OFT. It has been cancelled in accordance with the provisions of section 37(1) of the Enterprise Act 2002.
2. The CC is under a duty under section 37(1) to cancel a reference if it is satisfied that the parties have abandoned arrangements for an acquisition of the kind mentioned in the reference. Under paragraph 15(8) of Schedule 7 to the Competition Act 1998, the Chairman of the CC may exercise the powers conferred by section 37(1) of the Enterprise Act 2002 to cancel a reference while an inquiry group is being constituted or before it has held its first meeting.
3. The Enterprise Act 2002 empowers the OFT to refer to the CC completed or proposed mergers for investigation and report which create or enhance a 25 per cent share of supply in the UK (or a substantial part thereof) or where the UK turnover associated with the enterprise being acquired is over £70 million.
